### **Behavior Evaluation for Inappropriate Elimination in Cats**

There is a direct correlation between mental health and physical health. Stress takes its toll on the health of cats; research has demonstrated an increase in sickness behaviors associated with stressful events.

Acute signs of stress include crouching, shaking, tail close to the body, dilated eyes, hissing and growling. These signs may be a result of a specific incident or threat.

Signs of chronic stress may develop over a long period of time, and can be more subtle. These include hiding and social withdrawal, over-grooming and inappropriate urination. Cats with chronic stress can appear nervous, be more fearful than other cats in the house and more prone to hide from visitors.

With that in mind, cats urinating outside of the litter box need a complete behavioral evaluation in order to develop a successful treatment plan.
